Are you a faculty member who plans on interacting with humans for research purposes? You may need prior human subjects' approval and should attend a short session on IRB basics. "IRB Made Easy" is the first in a series of seminars that have been created to help investigators negotiate the submission, review and approval process of human subject's research.

Jane A. McCutcheon DDS, PhD is an Associate Professor in the Department of Basic Sciences in the College of Dentistry and the Faculty Liaison for Compliance in the Office of the Senior Vice Provost for Research at New York University. Dr. McCutcheon has been involved in study design for clinical trials for the Bluestone Center for Clinical Research, as well as conducting several translational studies. In addition, Dr. McCutcheon is a member of the Social, Educational, and Behavioral IRB at New York University starting in 2000, and she created the current system of reviewing exempt/expedited applications outside of the full board meeting at New York University. Dr. McCutcheon has developed a seminar series on human subject's related issues for undergraduate/graduate students and faculty members. She provided the initial trainings at NYU Abu Dhabi for the faculty, students and IRB members to assist in forming the NYU-AD IRB. Currently Dr. McCutcheon is the co-chair of the human subjects subcommittee for the Federal Demonstration Partnership and is the instigator of a demonstration to allow investigators to self-determine exempt status.
