New Summer Opportunity in NY or DC

Are you a Non-US Citizen?

Interested in staying in NYC or DC over the summer?

Want to pursue an internship or research experience (such as the DURF)?

It is now possible for you to be at NYU NY or NYU DC without enrolling in 6 credits, thanks to the new NYU Shanghai 1 credit Practicum course. A reminder that DURF is a research experience, if you are accepted and plan to conduct your research at

NYU NY or NYU DC and not enroll in summer courses you must apply for the 1 credit practicum course. It is important to note that there is one option for students who have been in NY/DC for one academic year and another for students who have not. Please be sure to review the policy below that applies to you. The links below include information about the application process along with necessary information about extending your visa.

Registration for Fall Classes

1. Check your registration appointment time in Albert and mark it on your calendar. Be sure to convert Albert's NY time to your local time zone!
2. **Declare or Change your Major(s) and Minor(s)** if you haven't done that yet.
3. Research suitable courses and read detailed course descriptions and class notes in [Albert Course Search](#). Browse **the list of courses at the study away sites that have already been approved to count** for NYU Shanghai degree requirements.
4. Fill out or Update your **Degree Audit Sheet** - VERY IMPORTANT!
5. Fill out the **Fall 2016 Course Intent Form** - VERY IMPORTANT!
6. Email your advisor once you have completed the above steps to get cleared for your registration.

The Dean's Undergraduate Research Fund (DURF) awards funding to NYU Shanghai portal students for summer research in any field of study. The research must be supported and supervised by a Faculty Mentor. A reminder that DURF is a research experience, if you are accepted and plan to conduct your research at NYU NY or NYU DC and not enroll in summer courses as a non US citizen, you must apply for the 1 credit practicum course.
